<b>Be beaten and spat upon</b>	<u>Isaiah 50:6</u> I offered my back to those who <b>beat me,</b> my cheeks to those who pulled out my beard; I did not hide my face from <b>mocking and spitting.</b>	<u>Matthew 26:67</u> Then they <b>spat</b> in his face and <b>struck</b> him with their fists. Others <b>slapped</b> him. <u>Matthew 27:26-30</u> . . . They <b>spat</b> on him, and took the staff and <b>struck</b> him on the head again and again. Also <u>Mark 14:65</u> ; <u>15:15-19</u> ; <u>Luke 22:63-65</u> ; <u>John 19:1</u>
<b>Be betrayed by a friend</b>	<u>Psalm 41:9</u> Even my <b>close friend,</b> whom I trusted, he who shared my bread, has <b>lifted up his heel against me.</b> <u>Psalm 55:12-14</u> If an enemy were insulting me, I could endure it; if a foe were raising himself against me, I could hide from him. <b>Be accused and afflicted, but did not open his mouth</b>	<u>Isaiah 53:7</u> He was <b>oppressed and afflicted,</b> yet he <b>did not open his mouth;</b> he was led like a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is silent, so <b>he did not open his mouth.</b>	<u>Matthew 27:12</u> When <b>he was accused</b> by the chief priests and the elders, <b>he gave no answer.</b> <u>Luke 23:9</u> He plied him with <b>many questions,</b> but <b>Jesus gave him no answer.</b> Also <u>Matthew 26:62, 63</u> ; <u>27:14</u> ; <u>Mark 14:61</u> ; <u>15:5</u> ; <u>John 19:9</u>
<b>Commit his spirit into God's hand</b>	<u>Psalm 31:5</u> Into your hands I <b>commit my spirit;</b> redeem me, O LORD, the God of truth.	<u>Luke 23:46</u> Jesus called out with a loud voice, "Father, into your hands <b>I commit my spirit.</b> " When he had said this, he breathed his last.
