Let's think of a few things we have to be thankful for here at Eastridge:


- We belong to Christ.

As children of God who are redeemed by His grace, thankfulness should flow easily from us. First Thessalonians 5:18 commands us to, "give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." Give thanks is a command that is to be on-going. It should be a normal characteristic of our lives. In fact, thanklessness is the mark of an unbeliever. Romans 1:21 states, "For although they knew God, they did not honor him as God or give thanks to him, but they became futile in their thinking, and their foolish hearts were darkened." Instead, we who know Christ have been given new hearts that should overflow with gratitude and worship of our glorious Lord. "Therefore, as you received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving" (Col. 2:6-7). As those who know Christ, let's continue in thankfulness

long past the holiday of Thanksgiving, "giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ" (Eph. 5:20).

While we may be extra busy over the Christmas season, I encourage you to think of one thing you are thankful for when you go to bed each night. It could be something about God, His Word, His works, or salvation in Christ that you are thankful for or something from your day you can thank God for (e.g., an answered prayer, a beautiful sunset the Lord made, God sustaining you through the workday, time with your family, etc.). May we approach this holiday as people who are constantly found being thankful to the Lord.



# The Disciple-Making Parent A Book Review by Cathy Mickelson

Chap Bettis hit a home run when he wrote this comprehensive guidebook for raising children to love and follow Jesus Christ. In my thirty-nine years of parenting, this is by far the best parenting book that I have read (actually, I listened to the audiobook). The author offers the audiobook for free on his website:

www.thedisciplemakingparent.com. Bettis draws on his 25 years of pastoral experience along with

having raised four children to adulthood as he helps parents apply biblical wisdom to child-raising. He presents the concept of the family as God's institution designed to glorify God and make disciples. He helps the parent understand what is involved in making a disciple (a follower of Jesus Christ). This is not a step-bystep how-to book. Bettis describes his book as a guidebook or playbook (as in football) where, depending on the age of your child, certain chapters will be more pertinent

than others. He even suggests skipping around depending on what chapters seem most pertinent to your situation. One of the things that caught my attention was his emphasis on the role of the Holy Spirit in parenting. He ends his introduction with this statement, "With the right mindset, and the Holy Spirit as our guide, let's proceed together."

The book begins with the first three chapters addressing foundational issues such as how discipleship, the gospel and parenting are intertwined, you are your child's most effective shepherd, and how your child's faith walk will be different from your Christian experience. Bettis


emphasizes the importance of our example of living out the gospel at home. He offers three truths regarding this:

- 1. Home is the front lines for the gospel. My first field of service is my home.
- 2. Home exposes the heart. We say things to our spouse and children that we would never say to someone else.
- 3. Home trains the heart. The Spirit empowers us to be patient and kind, expecting nothing in return.

Bettis gives helpful guidance on how to prepare our children for the gospel message, speaking to them for their conversion, and teaching them about the struggle between the flesh and the Spirit. One section addresses the "heart" and the value of good communication with our child. Many parents struggle with how to impart Scripture to their children. This book gives very helpful advice on how to nurture them in the truth of God's Word. Other topics addressed include teaching them to deny worldliness and live for the kingdom, the power of prayer, helping them work through

their doubts about the Christian faith, choosing friends wisely, and living their life in the power of the Holy Spirit as they seek God with a whole heart.

In addition to the free audiobook, Chap Bettis has a podcast and an audioblog. These can be found under the titles The Disciple-Making Parent Podcast and The Disciple-Making Parent AudioBlog. Be sure to check out his website, www.thedisciplemakingparent.com. I encourage you to take advantage of these wonderful resources to help guide you on your journey to becoming the disciple-making parent God is calling you to be.

# Kim Turnbull Retires as Our Church Administrative Assistant by Daná Freeland


Kim and Robert Turnbull and their family first came to Eastridge Baptist Church about 20 years ago. They had both grown up in western Canada but had moved to Portland, Oregon in the late 1990s. However, they soon found that they didn't enjoy the Portland area, so they moved to Covington when Robert was offered a job in the Seattle area. Their search for a church home ended

when they came to Eastridge. They enjoyed the warm, welcoming atmosphere, and their small group quickly became their second family.

Kim mentioned some of the other jobs and training she has had over the years that prepared her for her role as our church's administrative assistant. After graduating from high school, she worked for several years for BC Tel – first as a mail clerk delivering mail to the office staff and later as a customer service representative who took customer orders. Next, she got an associate's

degree in Computer Technology. After earning her AS-T degree, she worked for a retail computer store providing customer computer support and training for about five years. Then, she was hired by TransCanada Pipelines in Calgary as a computer support representative for their natural gas division, where she worked her way up to supervisor. Kim says that this was both the most interesting and challenging job she has had, as she worked with many different people at all levels of the organization, including senior management. In 1998, they moved back to British Columbia for a short while before moving to Oregon and then Washington, during which time Kim was a stay-athome mom to their three children until their youngest went into middle school. In 2009, Kim began her role as administrative assistant at

Eastridge. Besides the usual tasks that we might expect a church administrative assistant does, such as answering the phone, responding to emails, coordinating the church calendar, preparing the weekly bulletins, and compiling the monthly church newsletter, I asked Kim about other aspects of her job.



### What would people never guess you do in your role?

The admin assistant is also the office janitor lol! I would take out the garbage and recycling, vacuum, occasionally dust (not my strength!!)

## What has been the most fulfilling aspect of your role at the church?

Helping people! I didn't like passing up opportunities to help others, especially those going through a difficult time. From an administrative perspective, my goal was to make things as easy as possible for them in hopes of relieving some of the burden they carried. The Lord uses people (like you and me) to show others the love of Christ and that was always such a privilege for me.

#### What is the most challenging part of your job?

The most challenging part of being the EBC administrative assistant is working with the technology (computers, networking equipment, phones, alarm system, surveillance cameras, Realm software, etc.) and knowing how to troubleshoot to keep things running as smoothly as possible. ### What has been your favorite part about working here?

Throughout the years, all the staff have been very fun to work with and I will miss them dearly.

Everyone experiences problems in their life and the best thing I can do is help them any way I can and pray for them. This applies to people in the church and those who come to the office looking for help. The Lord puts these people in my path for a reason, and it's up to me to minister to them where they're at in life.

#### What words of wisdom do you have for Jennifer?



#### Thank you for your years of dedicated and faithful service to our church body, Kim!



### Myanmar Bags of Hope (BOH) 2022

Eastridge Baptist Church will once again support indigenous Christians in Yangon, Myanmar (Rangoon, Burma) to reach into the city slums and share the good news of Jesus Christ to the majority Buddhist community through the Bags of Hope (BOH) ministry.

This will be the tenth year for the Bags of Hope outreach. This ministry reaches five slum areas of Yangon with the distribution of rice and gift bags filled with toys, toiletries, flip-flops, and a gospel tract written in the local dialect (all BOH items are locally sourced in Myanmar). This year, the bags will be distributed by the youth group of Agape Myanmar Mission Church which borders the slum areas. After the December



distribution is complete there is on-going ministry to the people in these slums through the local church.
