Caps & Gowns and Wedding Gowns

from the desk of Pastor John

Summer is an exciting time, not because school is out and vacations are on, or because the sun is out and the days are longer (although after the long, cold, wet winter we had, seeing the sun is very exciting!). The end of spring and the beginning of summer is full of anticipation because it brings many people to a point of great change in their lives.

Many young people are moving on to new and thrilling parts of life. Some are graduating high school and will go off to that wonderful adventure known as college. For many of them, college will be their first real taste of adulthood. They will be responsible for themselves in a way they never had to before. It can be a wonderful time of growth and discovery. But sadly, for too many young people, it becomes a time of storing up regret and developing emotional scars.

Too many young people have taken the freedom they have in college to experiment with the wrong things. They have followed the crowd and the desires of the flesh and have reaped the consequences. Solomon, the author of Ecclesiastes, describes his relentless pursuit to find meaning and purpose in life. He concludes that when all is said and done, the best thing a person can do is “fear God and keep His commandments...for God will bring every act to judgment, everything which is hidden, whether it is good or evil.”

Prior to his conclusion, in **Ecclesiastes 11:9a** Solomon sarcastically spoke to the youth and said, “Rejoice, young man, during your childhood, and let your heart be pleasant during the days of young manhood. And follow the impulses of your heart and the desires of your eyes.” That seems to be the philosophy of many of today’s youth.

But they would do well to read the next sentence – (**vv. 9b, 10**), “Yet know that God will bring you to judgment for all these things. So, remove grief and anger from your heart and put away pain from your body, because childhood and the prime of life are fleeting.” Solomon learned

the hard way that the scars of poor decisions last much longer than the seasonal pleasure of sin.

Pray for those going off to college. Pray that they will be faithful to the Lord and will not believe the lie of Satan and his demons that “fun” requires them to compromise their testimony. Pray that they will know how to control themselves in sanctification and honor. Pray that they will not

make choices that will leave scars and shame. Pray that they will honor the Lord with their lives.

Some will be graduating college and heading out to make their mark on this world. They are entering the harsh realities of life. They will be searching for jobs, deciding where to live, and hoping to find love. They, too, face choices and challenges. As they seek to enter the workforce they will first face the challenge of finding a job in their desired field. They may find that the job they want is in short supply. Others will find themselves in work situations that appear to ask them to compromise their Christian convictions. Some will find themselves in situations where they are required to refer to a male co-worker as "she" or "her."


Pray that they will be lights to the world and salt to the earth. Pray that they will let their light shine in such a way that others will see their good works and glorify God. Pray that they will recognize that they are the pillar and support of the Truth. Pray that their attitudes and actions will reveal the love and joy of Christ. Pray that they will not be overcome with evil but will overcome evil with good. Pray that they will be ready always to give an answer to those who ask them the reason for their hope.

Still others will be putting on wedding gowns (or tuxedos) this summer. At last count, three young couples that I know of will tie the knot. They will embark on a new, exciting, and challenging part of life. They will have the joys of experiencing all the privileges of marriage. They will experience many "firsts" together. They will also have to navigate the challenges of two becoming one. They will have to learn the art of compromise and grow in communication skills. They will have to live out the clearly defined roles of husband or wife. They will have to ad-

just their expectations from the "fantasy" of the person they are marrying to fit the "reality" of the person they married.

Pray that they will turn to the Word for answers and not to the world. Pray that their speech will always minister grace to the hearers and be beneficial to the need of the moment. Pray that they will love sacrificially and not demandingly. Pray that they will be quick to repent and quick to forgive. Pray that their lives and their marriage will be an example of Christ to all who know them and observe them.

This time of year brings with it some significant changes for many people. Whether the change involves a cap & gown or a wedding gown (or both), let's love them all enough to remember to pray for them.



Proverbs 22:6 is a popular parenting verse that receives much application but little interpretation. Most English translations render it almost identical to the King James Version: “Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it.” What is this verse saying?

What the Verse Actually Says


The Hebrew of Proverbs 22:6 is literally: “Initiate the youth upon the mouth of [i.e. a figure of speech meaning ‘according to’] his way, even when he is old he will not turn from it.” Compare this to the English translations and you will find that there are two main differences in the first half of the verse. First, the command is “initiate” rather than “train up.” Second, the English interprets “his way” to mean “the way he should go.” The conclusion from the English version is that this verse is a call to parents to train their children in God’s ways so that when they grow up, they will follow the good ways in which you trained them. Is this what the proverb means?

Initiate the Child in His Way

In Deuteronomy 20:5 a man is exempted from military service if he has built a house but has not dedicated or initiated it yet. Although the house is built, he has not had the chance to get his house running yet. It’s built, but not functioning. He needs to take time to make it operational. The same word and concept is present in Proverbs 22:6. The command is to get the child going. Start the child really living life. How does Solomon command for that to happen? By starting the child on his way.

Whose Way?

One’s way describes the path of life someone chooses, wise or foolish (cf. Proverbs 11:5; 12:15; 14:12). In the original of Proverbs 22:6 there are no modifiers like “should go.” It’s simply “Initiate a child according to his way.” That is, the child’s way. If you know anything about children, and if you know anything about



what Proverbs says about children, then it would seem an odd command indeed to tell parents that they should train a child not according to the standard of God’s Word, but according to the standard of the child’s ways. Elsewhere, Proverbs comments, “Folly is bound up in the heart of a child” (22:15); “a child left to himself brings shame to his mother” (29:15). A child’s way is the way of folly and shame. Solomon is not being foolish in issuing a command to start a child on his own way. He’s using irony to sharpen our ears to the folly of this kind of parenting! Either we have done or know of others who raise children according to a child’s preferences, not the standard of the Word of God.

Grown Fools

The first half of the verse paints a scenario of a child who is raised by his parents to follow his heart. What’s the result? Even when he is old, he will not depart from his way which is the way of folly and shame. The consequence is a grown man who has the heart of a child, and not in a good way! Folly has not been driven out, and so all the warnings about the foolish in Proverbs will apply to this grown child.

Conclusion

Solomon gives a command that should not be kept. He sharpens our ears by saying something unexpected to drive home the real point. “Begin a child down his own road, when he grows up, he will remain a fool.” Dan Philips’ interpretive paraphrase is: “Start out a youth after his own chosen way—and he will never grow out of it” (*God’s Wisdom in Proverbs*, 367). Jay Adams writes, “The verse stands not as a promise but as a warning to parents that if they allow a child to train himself after his own wishes (permissively) they should not expect him to want to change these patterns when he matures” (*Competent to Counsel*, 158). Solomon’s not promising, he’s warning!

God Opens Doors

A team from our college and career group is heading to Zakynthos, Greece July 5–18 for a short-term mission trip. In this article, one of the team members, Belén Elliott, describes the role the team will play while in Greece.

“Zakynthos lies approximately 200 miles west of Athens, Greece. We will be partnering with Eastridge-supported full-time missionaries Takis and April Korianitis to put on a week-long kids camp for children ages 7-12.

This camp is such a unique opportunity because Greece is considered the seventh most difficult country in the world in which to share the gospel! On top of that, it is illegal to share Christianity with those under 18 years old without signed parental permission. The local church has been wanting to put on this camp for several years to reach the children in their community, as they had done many years ago. But, in 2015, a referendum made the camp illegal, so the door was closed. Then, when they found a way to make it work through signed parental permission

in 2016, they couldn't find enough help because most of the members of their church work in the tourist industry which is at its peak during the summer months. The door was closed once again. Finally, this year my church [Eastridge] got in contact with them and offered to send a team to help with whatever was needed, and they responded with an emphatic thanks, praising God for answering their prayers!

They told us that without the outside help, they would not be able to put on the camp, an invaluable ministry to approximately 50 kids from unbelieving families.

When my team and I go to help, we will be sleeping outdoors in tents on the church property during our stay in the village. At the camp, we will work behind the scenes with meal prep and cleanup plus interact with kids constantly—from sunrise to sunset—doing everything from crafts to sharing our testimonies. Everything we do will enable the local believers to build a bridge for the Gospel of Jesus.

When time allows, we plan to visit homes in the village and distribute approximately 4,000 newsletters from the local church. We will also assist as needed at the church on the two Sundays that we will be with them. All of these activities will be designed to maximize opportunities to build relationships with the people in the

village and share God's love and the Good News of Jesus Christ.”

Thank you to all who helped at and supported the May 21st Car Wash and Garage Sale fundraiser. The team raised more than \$2,600—the most successful fundraiser to date! The team sincerely appreciates the support from the Eastridge family in this ministry!

Why Should I Bother?

I know what you're thinking when you hear the name *Realm*. "Why would I bother having yet another account on my computer? That means another website name, username, and password to remember. Ugh!"

Well, here are some examples that might help you see how *Realm* can be beneficial!

Scenario #1:

Diane serves in the infant nursery and is unable to help on her scheduled day, so she'll need to switch with another nursery worker. First, Diane needs to locate the nursery schedule in her email (she vaguely remembers it being sent out). After scrolling through tons of emails, she finally locates the schedule. She then hunts through her junk drawer at home to try and locate the 3-year-old paper copy of the Eastridge Directory. After a successful search, she finds the contact information for a couple of people listed on the nursery schedule. Diane tries calling Mary Jones first, but to her dismay she hears, "this number is no longer in service." After a somewhat frustrating few phone calls, Diane finally finds someone to trade shifts with.

Realm's Solution to Scenario #1:

Diane quickly logs into her *Realm* account on her home computer and clicks on the Groups option. She selects the Nursery Workers group, then clicks on the Files tab and opens the Infant Nursery Workers' Schedule pdf file. After identifying a few people to contact, Diane types Mary Jones' name in the search bar in the top right-hand corner of the *Realm* screen. Up pops Mary's current contact information. Diane clicks on Mary's email address, waits for her mail program to load and then sends Mary an email asking to trade nursery shifts. No out-of-date contact information and no searching for paper copies of schedules or directories!

Scenario #2:

Jason is stuck on the 405 and will be late for a meeting at the church with Eastridge members Fred and Peter. Jason is pretty sure he has a paper copy of the Eastridge directory either in his car or at home. He's hoping it's in his car so he can get a contact number for either Fred or Peter and let them know he'll be late. Jason pulls off the freeway (safety first!) and

hunts through the pile of papers on the back seat, but doesn't spot the directory. So, Jason pulls out his phone, logs onto the Eastridge website and locates the church phone number. When Kim answers the phone, Jason asks if she has the phone number for Fred or Peter. Kim looks up the number in Realm and relays it to Jason. With phone number in hand, he calls Peter and lets him know he'll be late.

Realm's Solution to Scenario #2:

Jason had stopped by one of the Realm app tables in the foyer at the end of April and Briana Borton helped him locate the Realm Connect app and install it on his android phone. He pulls off the 405 (safety first!), opens the Realm app (Jason just leaves the app running on his phone so he doesn't have to log in all

the time) and types in Peter's name. Peter's contact information pops up on Jason's screen. He clicks on Peter's cell phone number then presses the call button that automatically comes up and he's in contact with Peter. No hunting for contact information or calling the church office for help.

These are just a couple of examples of how Realm can actually be useful! For information on how to create an account and log into Realm, use the search feature to find people, communicate with groups, or give online or view your giving history (**all** giving, not just online giving), pick up a copy of the **Realm User Guide** located in the foyer. 
